### Why study the Master of European and International Law in Beijing?

In the past 30 years, China has become one of the world's largest economies. Most global companies are operating on the Chinese market. Trade is flourishing and the European Union is one of China's largest trade partners. At the same time the Chinese legal system is in a state of rapid development.

### Demand for international experts in Chinese law rises

As a consequence, demand for legal professionals who combine a high command of European and international law with special expertise in Chinese legal matters is rising. The Master of European and International Law programme offered by the China-EU School of Law (CESL) at the China University of Political Science and Law (CUPL) in Beijing offers the unique opportunity to acquire this highly sought-after legal expertise.

The China-EU School of Law at the China University of Political Science and Law in Beijing is the only Chinese-foreign law school in China. It was initiated by the People's Republic of China and the European Union in 2008. The school is supported by 16 universities and educational institutions in China and Europe. The Consortium Office is at the University of Hamburg. In 2014, 96 % of CESL double master graduates found employment in the legal sector immediately after graduating.

### Integrated into one of China's best universities in the field of law

CESL is integrated into the China University of Political Science and Law, one of China's highest-ranking universities in the field of law. In its 50 years' development, CUPL has fostered more than 200,000 graduates, taken part in virtually every legislation activity of the state since its foundation and led the jurisprudence theoretical innovation as well as the legal conceptual renewal of China, representing its international exchanges in the field of law.

## Open-minded students

Students of the LL.M. become acquainted with principles, regulations and procedures of European and international law in order to understand the functions of law in an economically- and politically-linked world. Current issues of law and policy receive special emphasis, as do interdisciplinary features such as economic, cultural and historical facets. All legal aspects are compared to the Chinese legal system. In addition, students can focus on Chinese public and civil law. Thus, students gain a deep insight into Chinese legal culture and tradition as well as the transformative process of civil and administrative law in the People's Republic of China.

## Excellent career prospects

The LL.M. programme is designed for students with a first law degree, who intend to specialise in European and international law and have a particular interest in China. Participants are carefully selected to create a dynamic and open-minded group representing different cultures. Professional prospects for graduates range from positions at the European Union and international institutions to employment at international companies and law firms.

## Flying Faculty

Students are taught by one of the most international law faculties worldwide. Most professors are selected from 16 top partner universities and educational institutions throughout Europe and China. Since many lecturers fly back and forth between China and Europe several times a year this faculty is called the 'Flying Faculty'. Additionally, several European lecturers teach permanently in Beijing to ensure continuity. In recent years, Prof. Peter Van den Bossche from the University of Maastricht taught WTO Law, Prof. Frank Stephen from the University of Manchester taught Financial Markets and Regulation, and Prof. Armin Hatje from the University of Hamburg taught the Legal Foundation of EU Law. The LL.M. programme is taught completely in English. CESL also supports students who opt to learn Chinese during their studies. Courses are taught in small classes by way of group discussions, presentations and workshops.

## Adventures in Beijing

Students can immerse themselves in Beijing life, experiencing not only China's capital but also one of the most exciting and innovative cities in Asia. The China-EU School of Law is located in the Changping district, a northern suburb of Beijing. Major attractions such as the Great Wall, Ming Tombs and Jundu Mountain Range are only a short distance away from campus.
